



ARE YOU EXPERIENCING FINANCIAL INFIDELITY?

Nearly a third of couples have experienced financial infidelity in their relationship, according to U.S. News & World Report.

While financial infidelity can certainly take on several forms, the survey findings identified that the biggest money-related lies that came up in relationships were secretive purchases (31.4%), hiding debts (28.7%) and dishonesty about income (22.6%).

The element they all have in common is that one partner hides or withholds information about a money-related decision. When the victim uncovers the truth, there's often a feeling of betrayal. In a way, it's similar to the fallout from romantic infidelity.

"Year after year, we find that people have these financial skeletons in their closets," says Ted Rossman, Bankrate's senior industry analyst. "People feel ashamed and embarrassed and end up hiding stuff – then the secret starts taking on a life of its own."

numbers. You may need to work with other people to be at your best. Do you need to build something that you can touch and see? Do you need variety or enjoy doing the same thing over and over?

** DEVELOP HABITS THAT LEAD TO YOUR SUCCESS. Take care of yourself. Eat to fuel your body, rest to recharge your mind, meditate to keep in balance. Create a routine. Routines allow us to spend less time making decisions.

** DEFINE WHAT SUCCESS MEANS TO YOU. The clearer we understand what success means to us the less time it will take to get there. For some, money is a measurement. 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DID YOU KNOW: WHY THE FOUR-LEAF CLOVER IS LUCKY?

- It is so rare in nature. Your chances of finding a four-leaf clover are about one in 10,000.
- ***** Druid priests used shamrocks to heal the sick, during worship rituals and to ward off evil.
- In Irish tradition the Shamrock or 3-leaf Clover represents the Holy Trinity: one leaf for the Father, one for the Son and one for the Holy Spirit. When a Shamrock is found with the fourth leaf, it represents God's Grace.
- In ancient Egypt, it was tradition to give a married couple a four-leaf clover as a blessing of their union.
- Some origins of the four-leaf clover date back to Adam and Eve. According to legend, Eve carried a four-leaf clover from the Garden of Eden to remind her of paradise. That means that anyone who has one can claim to hold a bit of Paradise.
