WHAT IS AN HSA?

A Health Savings Account (HSA) is a tax-advantaged account that allows you to set aside money for qualified medical expenses. If you make the contributions, you receive a tax deduction, making it a valuable tool for tax planning. For most people, an HSA is the only way to get a tax deduction for medical expenses.

KEY FACTS:

- ** To contribute, you must have a high-deductible health plan (HDHP) that qualifies. Check with your health insurance provider to confirm your plan's eligibility.
- *You receive a tax deduction when you contribute to your HSA, and earnings grow tax-free. Contributions can be made up until April 15 of the following year.
- **\$\text{Contribution limits for 2024:}**
 - \$4,300 for an individual plan
 - \$8,550 for a family plan
 - An additional \$1,000 catch-up contribution is allowed if you're 55 or older.
- ** No "use-it-or-lose-it" rule—the funds remain in your HSA until you spend or withdraw them. However, withdrawals for non-medical expenses are taxable.
- **Once you enroll in Medicare, you can no longer contribute to an HSA, even if you still have a qualifying health plan. However, you can continue using existing HSA funds.
- # HSA funds can be used for IRS-approved medical expenses, including:
 - Prescriptions, doctor visits, deductibles, copayments, coinsurance
 - Flu shots, crutches, hearing aids, motorized wheelchairs, X-rays
- *You can also use HSA funds to pay for Medicare premiums, COBRA premiums, and long-term care premiums.

There is ongoing discussion about expanding this tax planning tool, and we'll keep you updated on any changes.
